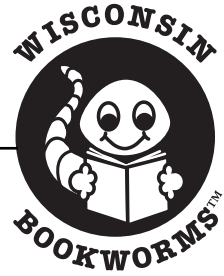

## Alphabeep

*Alphabeep* is a vehicle adventure from ambulance to Zamboni. This book is complete with beeps, zipping, zooming and vrooooooom! *Alphabeep* is an exciting book reinforcing the A B Cs.

**Before you read this book:** Ask the children to name as many kinds of cars, trucks and machines as they can. Write the names of the vehicles on slips of paper. Make a poster-size alphabet chart. Ask the children to match the first letter of the vehicle name on the slip of paper with the correct letter of the alphabet. Tape the vehicle name beneath the letter it matches. Sing the alphabet song with the children. Point to the name of the vehicles as the initial letter is sung.

**While you read this book:** Model holding the book right side up and demonstrate carefully turning the pages. While reading the story, ask the children to name other items and names that begin with each letter of the alphabet.

**After you read this book:** Compare the names of the cars, trucks and machines in the book with the vehicles mentioned by the children. Create pictures of the vehicles and tape them below the letter they begin with. Go through *Alphabeep* and point out the road signs pictured. Ask the children to help you decode what the picture signs mean. Make traffic signs out of cardboard. Affix the signs onto paper towel or toilet paper rolls. Use the road signs in dramatic play.

Suggested signs include: stop, yield, no U turn, school crossing, winding road ahead, road is slippery when wet, no trucks allowed and watch for fallen rocks.
