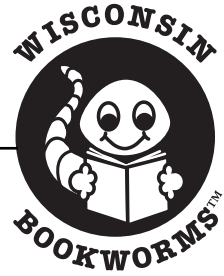

## Froggy Bakes a Cake

It's Froggy's mother's birthday, and Froggy wants to bake her birthday cake all by himself. He gathers the chocolate, sugar, eggs, flour, and pretty soon, Froggy has all the ingredients he needs to make a big mess!

**Before you read this book,** check out some of the other great "Froggy" books to learn more about Froggy and his family.

**While you read this book,** have fun with the sounds of the words: "Frrooggy," "flip flop flop," "glub glub glub," and, of course, "oogelly boogelly burbly bake."

Reading tip: Read many stories with rhyming words and lines that repeat. Invite the child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as he or she reads along with you.

**After you read this book,** make frog puppets. Paint or color one side of a paper plate green and the other side red. When dry, fold the plate in half with the red part inside. Cut out paper legs and eyes and glue them on the plate.

Play "frog leap." Show your kids how to leap like a frog. Pretend you are in the swamp, play music and leap—short leaps, long leaps, fast and slow leaps. Use rest mats as the lily pads.

Make a birthday cake for someone you love. Don't forget your "oogelly boogelly burbly bake."
